Shire of Carnarvon	Clean Community Coffees	Clean Community Coffees will provide a coffee voucher for participating local cafes in exchange for a bag of collected litter. This program will focus on the Fascine area and marine environment. It will incentivise local residents to pick up litter and take ownership for the cleanliness of Carnarvon. This program aims to reduce litter by promoting behavioural change, removing the social acceptability of littering by preventing build-ups of litter, and promoting and rewarding the efforts of volunteers and locals to keep the town clean.	\$ 3,500.00
Track Care WA inc	Spare Wheel Rubbish Bags	Track Care WA Inc conduct clean-ups at: Yeagarup Dunes, Wilbinga, Wandoo Woodlines, Canning Stock Route, and Mundaring Powerlines Track. This grant will be used to purchase 40 vehicle spare wheel mounted canvas litter bags that will have the KABC & TCWA Logos. These bags are durable, reusable, transferable and replace the need for plastic bags to collect litter. As the bags will have a KAB and TCWA visual message, the public will see the in-kind support being shown by both organisations in clean-up efforts and by default, educate the wider community to be more aware of where they dispose of their rubbish.	\$ 7,200.00
Nannup Community Resource Centre	Nannup Crafty Kids	An event to promote litter management and education. The day event will be targeted at parents, and children aged 6-12 years of age, within the Shire of Nannup. The event intends to raise awareness how to reduce littering with fun learning activities for kids. This includes delivering a presentation to discuss the issues of littering in WA, activities for children to repurpose discarded items, and a Q&A for kids to learn what they can do to reduce litter and what to do if they see it in public areas.	\$ 3,500.00
Comet Bay College	Keeping Comet Bay College Clean- Re-education and Litter Busting Campaign	<p>Comet Bay College's Sustainability Committee and The Eco Team will implement a series of clean-up our school days whilst re-educating students about the benefits of eliminating the amount of litter at school grounds.</p> <p>There will be three campaigns over the project year: Term 2 Week 7, Term 4 Week 7 in 2023, and Term 2 Week 7 in 2024.</p> <p>All students for years 7-12 will participate in an education campaign consisting of a series of 4 lessons. The main message focus is on the serious effects and the amount of litter left on and in our school grounds.</p> <p>The Eco Team will create a series of video messages to educate students on where to put each type of litter, plus recruit other students to join their volunteer group that is held weekly at Friday lunchtime at CBC.</p> <p>Students can win prizes by receiving a raffle ticket for being caught 'doing the right thing' and throwing litter in relevant bins on Friday the 9th of June during the school's first anti-littering campaign of 2023, and other campaigns.</p> <p>This grant will help to reduce litter factors at CBC by:</p> <p>(i) Funding the purchase of new rubbish collection equipment for any littering clean-up events to ensure students are protected and to improve litter collecting efficiency.</p> <p>(ii) Student Eco Team green hi vests with their logo to highlight the volunteer group in action during all their programs and initiatives. The students will be safe and identifiable and be easily seen by the community doing the right things.</p> <p>(iii) Prizes to be given during the campaigns such as re-useable drink bottles.</p>	\$ 2,575.00

<b>The Shire of Capel</b>	Captivate Litter	The Shire of Capel will hold a stream of workshops, competitions and art sessions preceding its event Captivate Capel in March 2024. The results will be showcased at Captivate Capel in their own area called "Captivate Litter". The three separate marquees will be called "Captivate Waste- repurpose" and "Captivate waste- recycle" and "Captivate -reduce and convert" with a special area just for litter in the reduce marquee. The grant funds only will be used supporting workshops and activities to showcase Litter reduction and art, raising awareness on how litter and microplastics impact our environment, water health and wildlife.	\$ 5,000.00
<b>Michael Wood and Associates Pty Ltd TAS Eco Surf Australia</b>	#3minutebeachclean	To enhance the opportunity of education through participation for our WA beachgoers on litter prevention and moving toward a circular economy, Eco Surf Australia will supply a series of A frame litter stations, holding tongs and litter bags (made from upcycled surf lifesaving uniforms) to place at 3 metropolitan surf lifesaving clubs The #3minutebeachclean encourages those who love the ocean to take 3-minutes to clean up their coastline.	\$ 5,000.00
<b>Shire of Leonora</b>	Keep Leonora Beautiful	A community awareness project to instil a sense of pride and improve litter behaviour via youth education, tourist focused media, and a community clean up event. By focusing on youth education and awareness The Shire seeks to contribute to a positive change in the litter behaviour of young people in the town and surrounding land, while wider community participation and education engages residents of all ages to take ownership of litter issues. Aim to target tourists through a media campaign, due to their travelling to less populated areas where bins aren't provided.	\$ 1,814.00
<b>Shire of Kent</b>	Stop the Toss	Littering of single use plastics within the Shire of Kent is a significant problem. Through an education and awareness campaign plus the purchase of a portable automatic water refill station, the Shire will reduce the damaging disposal of single use plastics. A portable water station will predominately be housed in Nyabing. The station will be available for use by community groups, free of charge. 100 reusable water bottles, promoting the 'Stop the Toss' message will be free to visitors and children, along with information on the dangers of littering in the community. School education on 'Waste Free Wednesday' will encourage the 'Stop the Toss' message.	\$ 4,995.00
<b>Nannup Garden Village Inc.</b>	Nannup Flower and Garden Festival - Take it Home with You Initiative	The two-week festival now in its 26th year has an increasing litter problem with overflowing bins particularly on busy weekend days. The initiative will involve providing a reusable, waterproof PUL zip bag that people can easily fill with their rubbish and easily put in their bag without worrying about leaks or smells. They can then dispose of the rubbish at home, wash it and reuse it or bring put it back in their bag for next time.	\$ 4,779.00
<b>Mandurah Offshore Fishing &amp; Sailing Club Inc</b>	Dolphin Quays Waterways Clean-up	The Dolphin Quays Marina is surrounded by residential and commercial development attached to the Peel Inlet channel. The project will involve providing additional compressed air for volunteer divers on three proposed clean-up times and then one annual clean up. The project will also better equip surface clean-up teams to allow for more establishment of regular extensive clean-up events to reduce and ultimately clear-up accumulated litter within the Marina waterways.	\$ 5,000.00
